EACH AMERICAN CONSUMES CROPS FROM TWO ACRES

It takes more than two acres of crops to produce food for an American, but it takes only one acre for a German, one-half an acre for a Chinese, and only one-fourth an acre of land to feed a Japanese, according to Dr. E. Baker, economist of the United States Department of Agriculture. Doctor Baker points out that these differences in the acreage of crops needed to feed one person are due principally to differences in diet. However, twice as much land is necessary to produce food for a Chinese as for a Japanese, because crop yields are much higher in Japan.
